

THE PERFECT ATTACHED BOW

No more concerns about your bows falling off.

1. Punch four small holes in a diamond pattern. Select the hole size based on the size or bulk of the ribbon. The distance between the holes should be relatively close. If they are too close – it is possible to tear the paper while you are working the bow.
2. From the front to back. Poke one end of the ribbon through the left hole, and the opposite end through the right hole. Pull up ribbon – giving enough slack to create the desired size of loops for the bow.
3. From the back to front. Cross over the two ribbon tails – poke one through the top hole, and the other through the bottom hole.
4. Taking a hold of the two ribbon tails – cross over and under as if forming the first step of a knot. As you pull this right, bring the top ribbon tail down towards the bottom so that the finished bow will have both tails hanging at the bottom.
